BYLAWS COMMITTEE NOTICE

Over the past year the bylaw sub-committee of the Board of Directors has been diligently re-writing the Canadian Highland Cattle Society bylaws, to modernize them and maintain the integrity of our herdbook.

Feedback from members, the board of directors and the Pedigree committee indicated that the current bylaws are difficult to understand, lengthy, easy to misinterpret, and some parts are outdated. We have simplified the language from legal jargon to everyday terms, making sections concise and easier to find, read, understand and act upon.

As technology evolved our bylaws didn't keep pace. One of the most impactful changes is allowing virtual participation at AGMs. Recognizing the expense of travel, virtual attendance we hope will increase participation.

The integrity of the herdbook is of utmost importance. Our current bylaws only require the sire to have DNA on file and every 75th registration is required to complete a proof of parentage DNA test. The Pedigree committee has seen a significant number of 75th tests fail with disqualified sires, disqualified dams – sometimes both. We have then seen issues with animals not being tattooed or incorrectly tattooed to what was reported on the registration certificate. While many failed 75th tests have been resolved, some have resulted in the animal(s) and entire herds being removed from the herdbook. To address this, our new bylaws, effective January 1, 2026, will require all animals born on or after this date to have DNA submitted and be DNA parentage verified to the sire. The animal must also be DNA parentage verified to the dam, if the dam has a DNA profile on file. The 75th test has been changed to every 25th registration, to ensure accurate registration of animals without a dam on file.

With Highland cattle reaching record high prices, it is crucial that buyers can trust the accuracy of our herdbook including pedigrees, tattoos, and colour. Although these changes add an extra step for breeders, we are confident they will uphold the reputation of CHCS and our members.

A copy of the new bylaws will be mailed to all members 120 days prior to the AGM for review. We welcome any feedback or questions you may have by emailing CHCS at highland@chcs.ca. It is important that as many members as possible attend the AGM, where we will motion to adopt the new bylaws. The AGM is being held on September 27th in Calgary, AB.
